12:00	Welcome remarks by Ecovisio president, Julian Gröger

Participants receive printed copies of Tamara Koblik's and Ivan Barbul's photos and a printout of each their biographies in their language, then split up in small groups and work with facilitators and veteran teachers on how to use the film and the biography in class.
